NEWTON'S APPLE TREE

The Kenneth Hunt garden features Newton's Apple tree, a clone from the original tree from which Sir Isaac Newton reportedly observed an apple fall, prompting him to formulate his theories of motion and gravity. It was planted in the Kenneth Hunt garden in 1975.

CAMPUS CENTRE

The Campus Centre is the central hub of Uni life, regardless of what you study. There is a vast variety of cafes, restaurants and a bar to socialise with your fellow students. The Centre also houses Doctors, Dentist, Australia Post, Pharmacy, Optometrist, Hairdresser, Phone and Travel facilities.



MONASH SPORT

Monash Sport welcomes students, staff and the general public. Walk through the vicinity to see the health and wellbeing opportunities that await you, such as the tan track, escape room, and fitness centre (including a large range of both pin-loaded and free weights as well as 75+ weekly group fitness classes). The aquatic facilities include two indoor heated swimming pools, spa, leisure pool, sauna and steam rooms. We also offer court sports and social sport competitions in sports such as squash, basketball, table tennis, hockey, tennis, netball, futsal and soccer.

ROBERT BLACKWOOD HALL

This is the venue for conferences, information sessions and graduation ceremonies that take place all year round. The Sir Louis Matheson library is the largest library on the Clayton campus and is now 12,480 square metres. It is the central humanities library housing over 1.5 million items, including a number of special collections.
